DETAILED VISA DESCRIPTIONS

1. Business Visit Visa

The Business Visit Visa facilitates short-term business activities such as meetings, training, and negotiations in Saudi Arabia. This visa can be valid for 30 to 90 days, with options for single or multiple entries as determined by the Saudi government.



Documents Required:

- Original passport valid for at least six months with two empty visa pages
- ▶ Health insurance for non-US citizens from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia
- Electronic invitation from a Saudi company
- Employment verification letter
- Company's business registration copy in Saudi Arabia

2. Permanent Family Visa

This visa allows close relatives of Saudi Iqama holders to visit family members residing in Saudi Arabia. The process can only be initiated by legal Saudi Iqama holders with at least 4 months of validity on their Iqama.



Eligible family members:

Parents, spouse, children, parents-in-law, siblings and their families.

Documents Required:

- Original passport valid for six months with two empty visa pages
- ▶ Health insurance for non-US citizens from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia
- Visa referral note from the Saudi Ministry of Foreign Affairs
- Proof of relationship between applicant and inviter
- Notarized letter for minors traveling alone or with one parent

3. Tourist Visa

The Tourist Visa caters to those wishing to visit Saudi Arabia for leisure or Umrah. This multiple-entry visa allows stays of up to three months and is valid for one year.

4. Residence Visa

The Residence Visa allows individuals to live in Saudi Arabia without needing a sponsor. This visa category includes permanent residency and renewable temporary residency options.



Documents Required:

- Original passport valid for at least six months with two empty visa pages
- Visa referral note from the Saudi Ministry of Foreign Affairs
- Proof of kinship (marriage certificate, birth certificate)
- Medical report certifying freedom from contagious diseases (not required for children under 16)
- Notarized letter for minors traveling alone or with one parent

5. Premium Residency Visa

Introduced in 2019, the Premium Residency Visa, also known as the Saudi Green Card, is aimed at attracting skilled expatriates and investors. Holders of this visa can work, do business, own property, and move freely without a sponsor.

6. Employment Visa

The Employment Visa is for individuals who have secured employment in Saudi Arabia. Applicants must provide a job offer, employment contract, medical information, and an official invitation from a Saudi employer.



Documents Required:

- Original passport valid for at least six months with two empty visa pages
- Online application via Saudi Visa Services
- Digital power of attorney from the Saudi employer
- Visa referral note from the Saudi Ministry of Foreign Affairs
- Sponsorship letter from the Saudi company
- Employment contract signed by both parties
- Certified and notarized educational documents
- Medical report with lab results
- Police report issued within six months of application

- Oman can





The fee varies based on the type of visa and the applicant's nationality. Check with the Saudi consulate for specific details.

How long is a Saudi visa valid?

The validity depends on the visa type. Contact the Saudi consulate for precise information.

What is a Saudi eVisa?

The Saudi eVisa is a one-year multiple-entry visa for citizens of 49 countries, allowing stays of up to 90 days for tourism and Umrah activities. Visit the Saudi eVisa portal for more information.
